

August 12, 2014 Lanesboro Council Meeting Minutes

Call to Order
Pledge of Allegiance

Roll Call - Dan Boughton, Regina Dilello, Jason Fissel, David Glidden, and Dale Rockwell present. Gail Hanrahan and Tom Nitterhour absent. Amanda Cook and Chris Maby also in attendance.

Action on July 8, 2014 meeting minutes: Motion by Dale, 2nd by Regina to approve as presented. Unanimously carried.

Correspondence & Resolutions: Maby provided resolution prepared by Myron for consideration. After discussion, council appointed Ed Arzouian via resolution to fill the vacancy created by Todd Glover's resignation. Motion by Jason, 2nd by Dale. Unanimously carried.

People requesting time: Bill Kuiper spoke on behalf of Lanesboro Cemetery. They would like to have the cemetery taken over by Lanesboro. He further explained that their lawyer cited a law which essentially forces the borough to take it over and indicated that they would take us to court if Lanesboro declined. Council inquired as to what funds they have - Bill stated their income is from burial plots (2 in the past 2 years) and the annual donation Lanesboro makes. He presented a copy of the law for review. A quick review by Maby indicated the law (copy attached) reads that the municipality "MAY" take it over if inclined. Maby will forward to Myron for further review. Brad Mead inquired to the status of the road repairs. Council noted that liquid fuels money and some gas money will be combined with the CDBG money when it arrives. A letter from Officer Rhonda Smith was read in its entirety and will be provided to Gail for filing.

Police report: read by Chief Smith, who also briefed everyone on the status of police at school.

COG report: emailed to everyone: Maby forwarded again after the meeting.

Streets Committee: Dale to coordinate with Herman on the paving at the new inlet at the end of Jefferson St. Maby still waiting to hear when the CDBG money will arrive. Motion by Jason, 2nd by Regina authorizing Maby to work with Bobbi Jo on potentially securing quotes for paving.

Sewer: Myron has contacted the Tri-Boro lawyer again regarding the possible purchase of the sewer.

Community Center: Amanda stated the issue with prior rental seems to be resolved. Chief Smith noted that he has seen people in cleaning the center on several occasions.

Website: Amanda will be at the next meeting and plans to take a picture of the council next meeting.

Old Business: none

New Business: Council considered options for CDBG application this year. After brief discussion, motion by Jason, 2nd by Regina authorizing Chris to pursue a grant application to make as many repairs to broken sections of the existing sidewalks on Main and North Main Streets. Unanimously approved.

Mowing ad: 2 bids were rec'd. The first was from Stoney Mtn Tractor Parts for \$900/each time for the eight properties. A second bid from Dan Boughton was \$1400 for the remainder of the season from August 12 to November 30. Motion by Regina, 2nd by Dale to hire Boughton. Unanimously carried.

Motion for adjournment by Regina, 2nd by Dale. Unanimously carried.

§ 13. Records to be completed within two years

Within two years after the passage of this act, every burial-ground
or cemetery company or association, in the cities of the first class,
shall have on file, for the inspection of all persons having an interest
therein, a complete record, if such information is obtainable, of all past
burials made in such burial-ground or cemetery, arranged in conformity
with the requirements of section one of this act. 1913, June 25, P.L.
564, § 2.

§ 14. Penalty for violation of act

Every person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions
of this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall
be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars. 1913,
June 25, P.L. 564, § 3.

§ 15. Care of neglected burial grounds given to boroughs or townships

Whenever any burial ground, incorporated or unincorporated, is
being neglected so as to become a nuisance, even though said burial
ground may occasionally be used for burial purposes, the court of
quarter sessions of the county in which such burial ground is situated
may direct that such burial ground be placed in the care of the council
of the borough, the township commissioners or township supervisors
of the township, under the direction and supervision of said court.
